OCSD UPDATE –

- The Sheriff shared that there continues to be E bike thefts. The bikes were unlocked. There was also a theft of a catalytic converter. A resident asked further questions about these thefts and about preventive measures.
- They will have free etching programs for the catalytic converters.

OC BOARD OF SUPERVISOR UPDATE –

- Robby appeared for Supervisor Foley. He provided a handout and overview of Property Taxes for Ladera Ranch. He explained that 5% of our taxes goes to the County. Questions were asked about Sheriff expenses which were stated at 6 million, yet Ladera only has 2 sheriffs' assigned. Follow up with the CEO with any questions.
- There is an E Bike Safety Town Hall at Ladera Ranch Middle School on April 6, 3-5 p.m.
- Senior Support Town Hall in RMV Guest House on March 26, at 2 p.m.
- He discussed Las Flores Ramp improvements
- They will be adding a crossing guard in Ladera at Meandering Trail.
- A resident mentioned concerns with the dump and the proposal to double its capacity, which is near SJHHS. She asked what the Supervisor's position is. Robby responded that it was sprung on them without being briefed and that they are looking into it.

38th SENATE DISTRICT UPDATE, SENATOR BLAKESPEAR-

- Kim Carr shared she proposed an E Bike bill dealing with E Motos. It would reclassify them as motorcycles. It would clarify the language and it is sponsored by the industry. SB 1167.
- Another bill would deal with nitrous oxide canisters that is flavored marketed towards children and has serious implications for children. Supervisor Foley was able to get the County to ban it, but it needs to be statewide. It is bipartisan.
- SB 965 regarding obtaining library cards without parental consent. The Bill seeks to allow 16 and 17 year olds to obtain a card without parental consent.
- She also has a couple of bills that deal with housing and obtaining RHNA credit.
- Women's history month.
- They will have Cheers for volunteers to celebrate volunteers in April.

ASSEMBLY DIST. 71 UPDATE –

- Rep Sanchez - No Appearance but we received an update. The update was that they are working several areas of legislation: no tax on tips legislation AB 1550; financial relief for homeowners AB 1620; closing the DUI loophole AB 1747; and Election integrity AB 1764.



CUSD Area 2 Trustee –

- Trustee Lisa Zollinger appeared.
- OSO Grande celebrated their 20th anniversary.
- She addressed how they have Board Meetings and Workshops to address policies and Ed Code updates.
- They will pilot a new language arts curriculum for K-5 students – the Science of Reading. It includes phonics again. A resident and prior teacher spoke up about her concerns on the program. Trustee invited her to be part of the committee.
- April will be Spring musical season and she encouraged us to attend.
- A resident spoke who stated she is a “public school advocate”. She is concerned that our trustee took money from a charter school during her campaign is concerned that a new charter school is being added and alleged conflict of interest. Lisa stated that she received only 2k from a charter school, out of 80K that she raised, and there was no conflict.
